Autism is the fastest growing developmental disability in the world, and today affects about 67 million people worldwide. Fewer than 30 years ago, 1 in 10,000 children were diagnosed with autism; today, 1 in 88 is being diagnosed with autism, and some recent estimates are higher. Boys are four times more likely than girls to have autism: 54% of boys have some form of autism.

With the incidence of diagnosis of Autism now so alarmingly high, supports offered by Children at Risk are needed more than ever.
