EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

accomplishments that "The little Charity who does BIG THINGS" has achieved yet again this year...the served, not only this year, but last year, as well. An increase in number of children served:

- 2010-2011 of 22%
- 2011-2012 of 38%
- 74% increase from 2010-2012!

Those numbers do not even include the Pilot Project "Saturday Fun Club" of 4 Camp-Like Saturdays in November and December that will average 15-20 children each day...These statistics arouse excitement and pride – but trepidation too...can this growth and I the programs and supports offered currently be sustainable?

As we face not only challenging economic times, but also the (hopefully!) short-term loss of a major 3rd party fundraising activity, these questions led me to some Goggling at www.scvs.org.uk:

- What is Sustainability? Sustainability is a widely used term that describes something's ability to endure. It is the ability for something's long term state of well-being.
- What is Sustainable Funding? Sustainable funding involves thinking about the long-term financial future of your organisation. Instead of viewing your projects or services in terms of the lifetime of your current grant, which is often no more than 12 months, it is about planning where you want to be further in the future, using a number of funding opportunities to achieve this, and continuing to monitor your progress.
- Why become more Sustainable? Avoiding grant i For more info and registration form see attachment. dependency and a reliance on charitable donations will help prevent fluctuating income, financial insecurity, low unrestricted funds for core costs, and mission drift, where grants are followed at the expense of beneficiaries' needs and the aims of the organisation. Instead, the long-term impact of your projects will be realised, you will be more in control of your own future, and you will also be more attractive to potential funders.

Children at Risk has already experienced the loss for 2013 of a Major 2011 & 2012 Major Funder for Camp Kaleidoscope, with another Major Funder (who will As 2012 draws to a close, I reflect on the come through in 2013 again) inquiring about CAR's efforts to find other Sustainable Funding....and I can concur with the statements above that pursuing grants is exponential growth in services and number of children a short-term endeavor – that then has to be repeated year after year.

> So consider this an All-Call – an appeal to Members and Supporters to help Children at Risk find Sustainable Funding, possibly in the form of Corporate Donors, who can consider the commitment of a small, but sustainable, Annual Gift – that will not "break the bank" and allow a demonstration of commitment to community!

RECIPE CORNER

Continuing with our new addition to our Quarterly Newsletter – "Recipe Corner"! We invite you to send us a favourite recipe – not necessarily GFCF, but those would be great, as cooking without gluten and milk products can be challenging. Here is one of my best recipes for GFCF cake/cupcakes, always a great thing to send with your ASD child, especially if others he is with are GFCF! They are tasty and light!!



BASIC YELLOW CAKE

(from Dietary Intervention as a Therapy in the Treatment of Autism and Related Developmental Disorders by Beth & Andy Crowell, 1992)

(For cupcakes, 2-8" cakes or 1 9x13" pan) Bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes

1 ½ cup Rice Flour

1 tsp. Xanthan Gum (my addition for

cohesiveness – available at specialty bulk food stores)

½ tsp.
1 cup
½ cup

Egg Yolks
4 water

1 tsp. Almond Extract1 tsp. Vanilla Extract

4 Egg Whites, beaten stiff

Sift together dry ingredients in a mixing bowl. Add shortening, yolks, and ½ cup of the water. Beat 3 minutes at medium speed in electric mixer, scraping bowl frequently. Add remaining ¼ cup water and extracts. Beat 2 minutes more at medium speed. Fold in beaten egg whites and pour into prepared cups or pans. Bake until cake tests clean – careful not to overbake.

Cool 5-10 minutes in the pan, then turn out and cool completely on a wire rack. Frost as desired.




